The Spring Mill Fire Company No.1 is accepting applications for the position of a full-time firefighter. The Spring Mill Fire Company No.1 is an equal opportunity employer.

Application & Testing Process

1. Candidates for employment shall submit a written application to the firehouse.
2. Following the submittal of the written application accompanied by a check or money order; payable to Spring Mill Fire Company, all candidates will participate in the physical agility testing on **Sunday, July 17, 2022, at 9:00 am at the Montgomery County Fire Academy, 1175 Conshohocken Road, Conshohocken, PA 19428.**
 - a. *No additional notice will be sent or communicated with the applicants regarding the physical agility test following the submission of the application. The applicant's application submission is a notice to attend the Physical Agility Test on the date and time above. Applicants should wear a long or short sleeve shirt, work gloves, hard sole shoes/boots, and a structural firefighting helmet (if you are not able to provide a structural firefighting helmet, please inform us and we will provide a structural firefighting helmet for you to successfully complete the physical agility test.*
3. Following the successful completion of the physical agility test, the candidate will be notified by mail of the date, time, and place of an oral interview.
4. Following the oral interview process, both fire companies may conduct background checks and medical examinations in preparation for a final candidate list for consideration for employment.

Full-Time Firefighter Minimum Application Requirements

Copies of all certificates and/or proof of minimum requirements are required to be included in the application packet at the time of submission.

- 21 Years of Age
- High School Diploma or GED
- Valid Pennsylvania Driver's License
- PA State Background Check
- Child Abuse Clearance
- Pre-Employment Drug Test
- Firefighter I – *IFSAC or Pro-Board Preferred*
- Firefighter II – *IFSAC or Pro-Board Preferred*
- NIMS 100, 200, 700, 800
- Hazardous Materials Operations Level Certificate and refresher certificate within the last twelve (12) months if the Original course certificate is outside of 12 months
- Emergency Vehicle Operations Course or equivalent
- Pump Operations I or equivalent
- Vehicle Rescue Technician (PA DOH or NFPA) or equivalent
- Current CPR, AED & First Aid Certificate
- Minimum 5 years as a certified Firefighter I IFSAC or Pro-Board firefighter
- Minimum 3 years as a certified Apparatus Operator (*Letter required from Department Chief*)
- ***Other preferred but NOT required Certifications***
 - Emergency Medical Technician
 - Engine Operations
 - Truck / Aerial Operations

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Spring Mill Fire Company No.1 - Full-Time Firefighter Job Description

Essential Job Functions

The following duties are normal for the position of full-time firefighter. These duties are not to be construed as exclusive or all-inclusive. Other duties not listed may be required and assigned.

Examples of Essential Job Functions are as follows:

- Responds to emergency calls by driving safely to incident scenes.
- Operates equipment safely for fire and rescue operations.
- Conducts salvage operations at fire scenes as directed.
- Works in conjunction with Police and Ambulance personnel on emergency scenes.
- Follows manufacturer's instructions to complete preventative maintenance requirements to ensure equipment remains in working order.
- Follows manufacturer's instructions to complete general repairs/maintenance of fire apparatus and equipment within their ability.
- Promotes fire safety by organizing training sessions, talks, and seminars.
- Conducts pre-plan drills of businesses and properties within the response district as assigned.
- Maintains personal protective equipment to be clean and in safe working condition at all times.
- Assesses situations quickly to decide the best course of action.
- Produces accurate written reports of emergency incidents.
- Participates in educational workshops, seminars, and programs to update job skills and knowledge as assigned.
- Performs other duties and assumes other responsibilities as required or assigned.
- Perform general maintenance of the apparatus including but not limited to cleaning and repairs when it is within the scope of the employee's ability.
- Perform general housekeeping duties in the firehouse to include cleaning and repairs.
- Perform general building and grounds duties including but not limited to general repairs and routine grounds maintenance when it is within the scope of the employee's ability.

Job Standards

- Communicates effectively; reads and understands the policies of the Fire Company including but not limited to the By-Laws, Rules & Regulations, Standard Operating Guidelines, Employee Handbooks & Policies.
- React calmly and think rationally in emergency situations.
- Understand and carry out complex instructions.
- Recognize non-standard activities, missing items, people, hazards, and details.
- Possess excellent eye-hand-foot coordination and physical stamina.



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- Sit and perform fine manipulation frequently.
- Stand for extended periods of time, walk, run, bend, crouch, kneel, climb, crawl, lift and carry up to 150lbs, push up to one (1) ton on a flat surface, and pull up to 175 lbs.
- Works well with both groups and independently.

Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities

- After a period of training, the ability to use and maintain firefighting equipment and to learn the theory necessary for effective firefighting and equipment operations.
- Ability to apply basic techniques of fighting fires.
- Ability to perform strenuous activities such as lifting heavy fire fighting equipment, climbing standard and aerial ladders, lifting and carrying people and equipment for rescue and salvage.
- Ability to work under conditions of heavy physical exertion in extreme heat and dust, in high and confined areas and smoke-filled spaces, and in all kinds of weather, and to maintain physical activity for prolonged periods of time.
- Ability to administer first aid, CPR, and other medical care in which the candidate is trained to do.
- Ability to think clearly and apply knowledge under stressful conditions and handle more than one task at a time.
- Ability to remain calm in emergency situations in all types of environments.
- Ability to establish a rapport with the community, officers of the fire company, volunteers of the fire company, members of Township Staff, the Police Department, the Ambulance Association, and civilians.
- Ability to understand and carry out instructions quickly and effectively.
- Ability to record information professionally, in written form.
- Ability to function independently and without direct supervision.
- Ability to work closely with people, including functioning as a team member and exercising tact or diplomacy, and display compassion, understanding, and patience.
- Ability to learn to utilize various types of electronic and/or manual recording and information systems used by the agency, office, or related units.
- Ability to promote the goals and mission of the Volunteer Fire Company.

Physical Characteristics

- Sufficient clarity of speech and hearing and other communication capabilities, with or without reasonable accommodation, which permit the employee to communicate effectively, including during emergency situations that may involve a high degree of noise.



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- Sufficient vision and ability to conduct scene size up observations with or without reasonable accommodation which permits the employee to effectively operate at a fire or related emergency scene.
- Sufficient manual dexterity with or without reasonable accommodations, which permits the employee to operate equipment used in firefighting
- Sufficient personal mobility and physical reflexes, with or without reasonable accommodation, which permits the employee to perform all duties involved in protecting life and property
- Sufficient overall physical health, to successfully complete the pre-hire physical agility test and post-hire requirements for handling rapidly moving situations where quick maneuvering in less than ideal situations involving obstacles, challenging climbing requirements, and structural collapse
